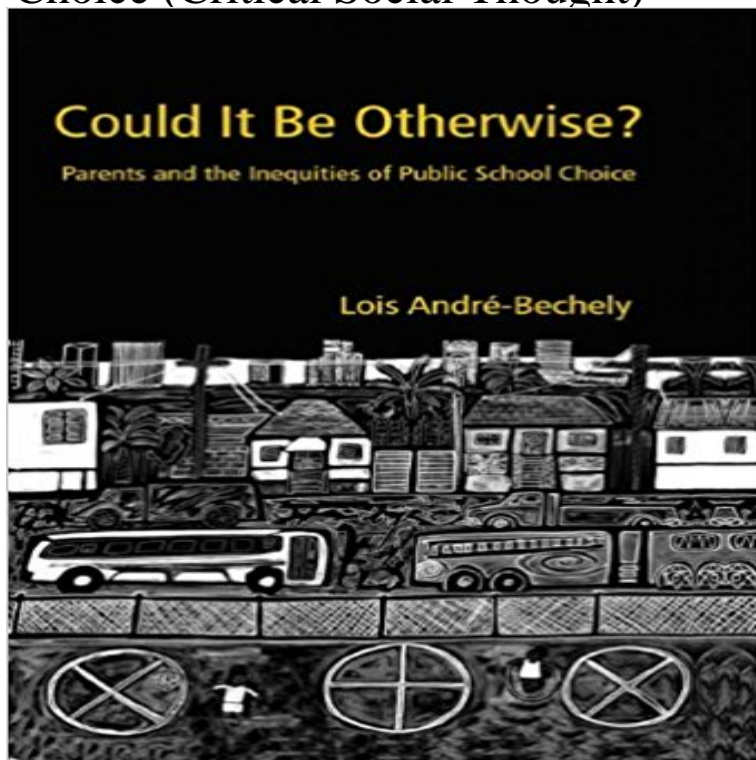


# Could It Be Otherwise?: Parents and the Inequalities of Public School Choice (Critical Social Thought)
