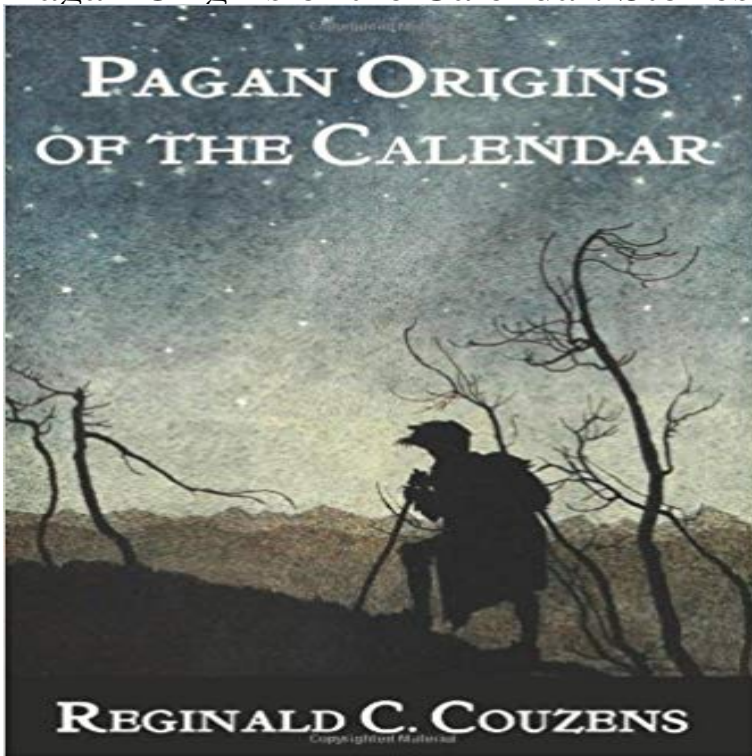


Pagan Origins of the Calendar: Stories of the Months and Days
