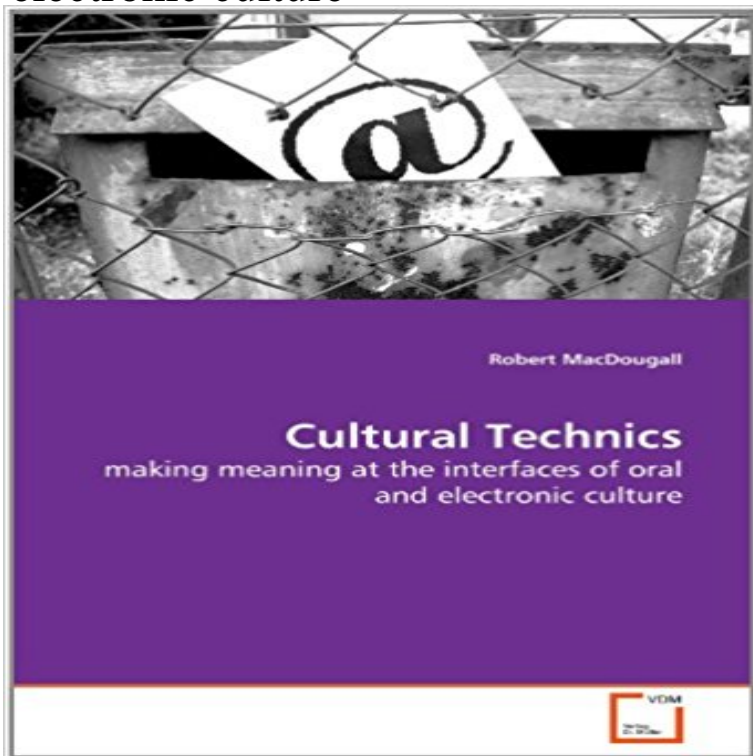


# Cultural Technics: making meaning at the interfaces of oral and electronic culture
