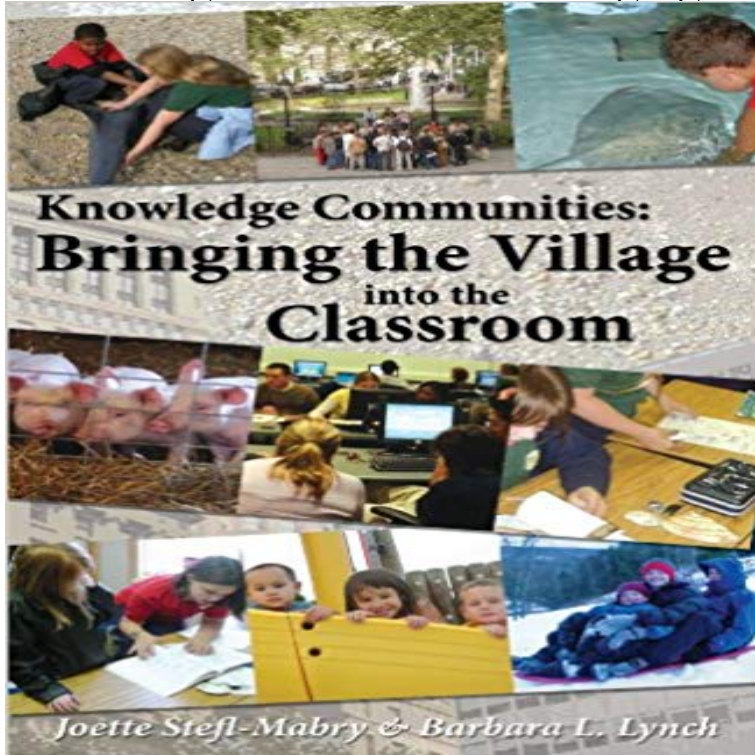


# Knowledge Communities: Bringing the Village into the Classroom
