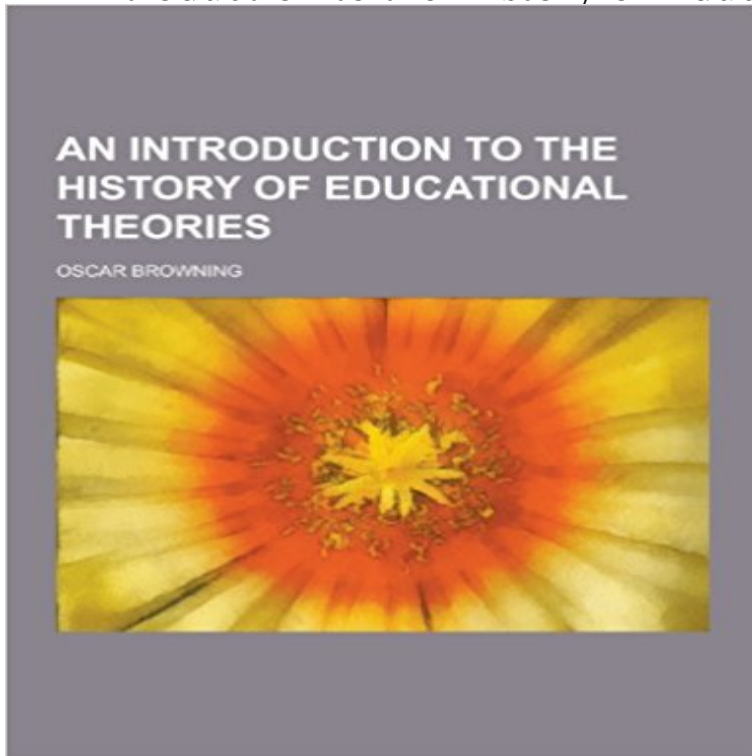

which must be written, corrected, and copied out within the hour....
