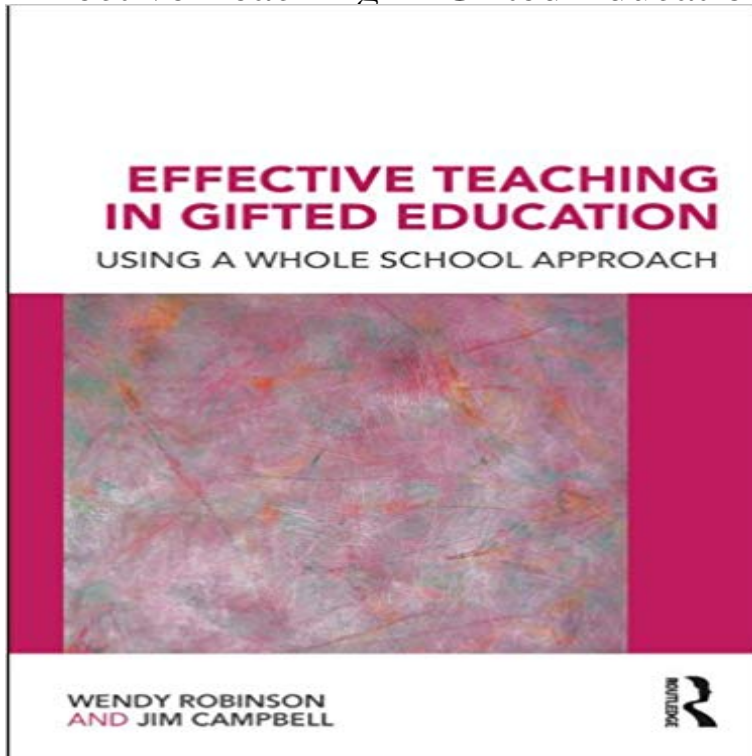


Effective Teaching in Gifted Education: Using a Whole School Approach
