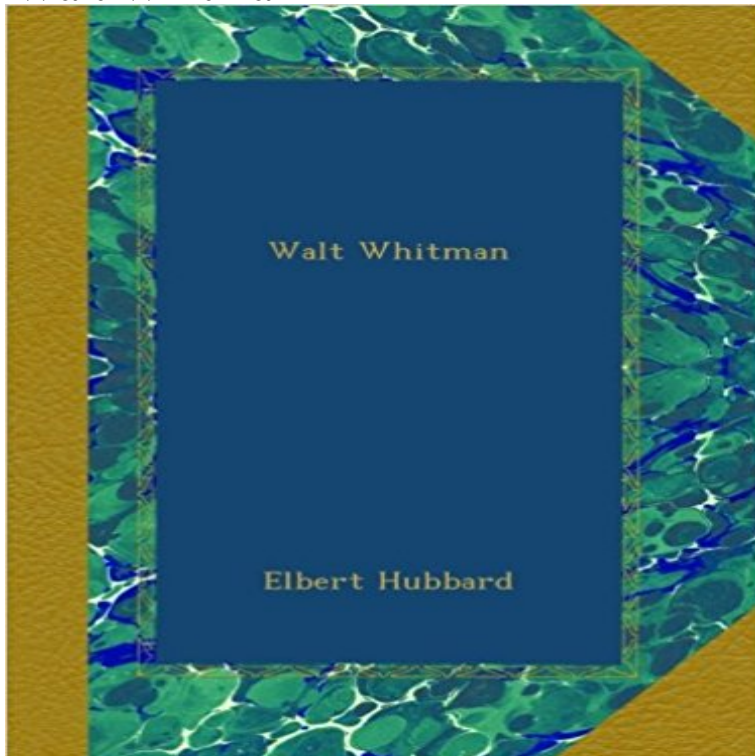


Walt Whitman
