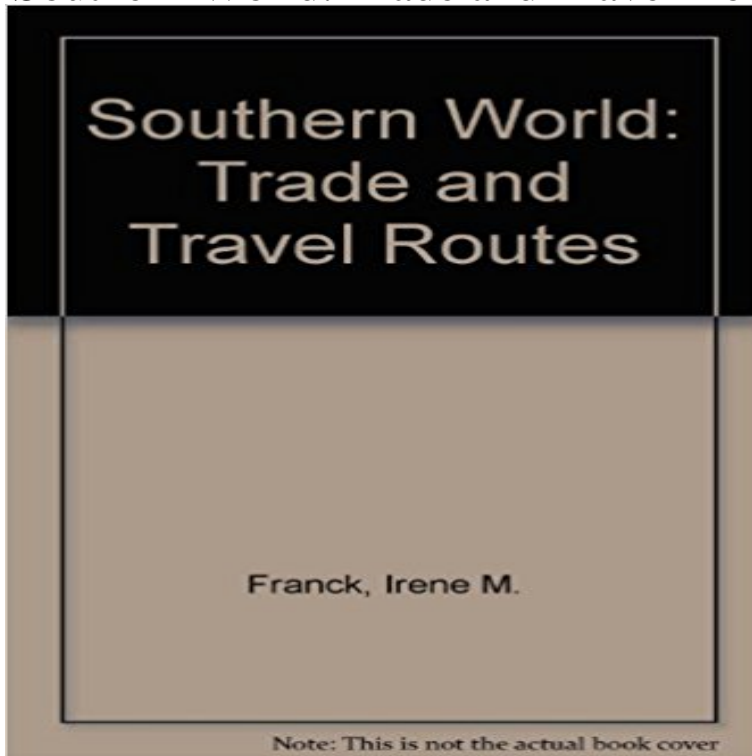


Southern World: Trade and Travel Routes
