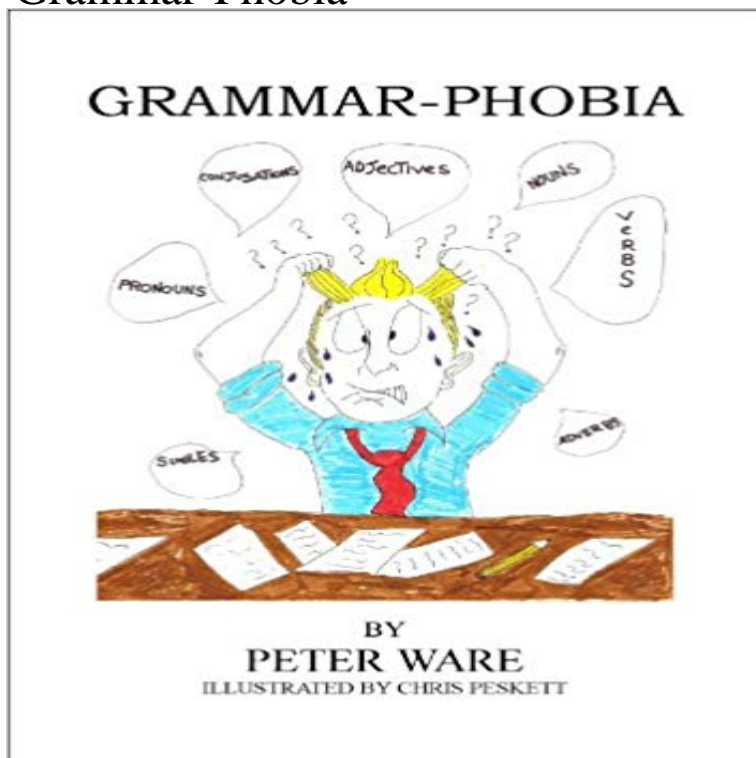


Grammar-Phobia



Grammar-Phobia is aimed primarily at native English speakers who would like to remind themselves how English grammar works. It seems curious that so many of us use and abuse our mother tongue so effectively every day, and yet many of us have forgotten about the underlying structure of English, if indeed we ever knew much about it! Most English speakers remember a little of what lies beneath. Verbs are commonly remembered as doing words, nouns as the names of things and adjectives as descriptive words, but beyond that, many of us just don't go. If you have learned English as a second language, then I hope you too will find this book of interest. Rather than try to include every possible variation and detail, I have concentrated on the main grammatical rules and conventions that will give you a working knowledge of the structure of English grammar, but without getting so deep into the detail that you lose your concentration.
