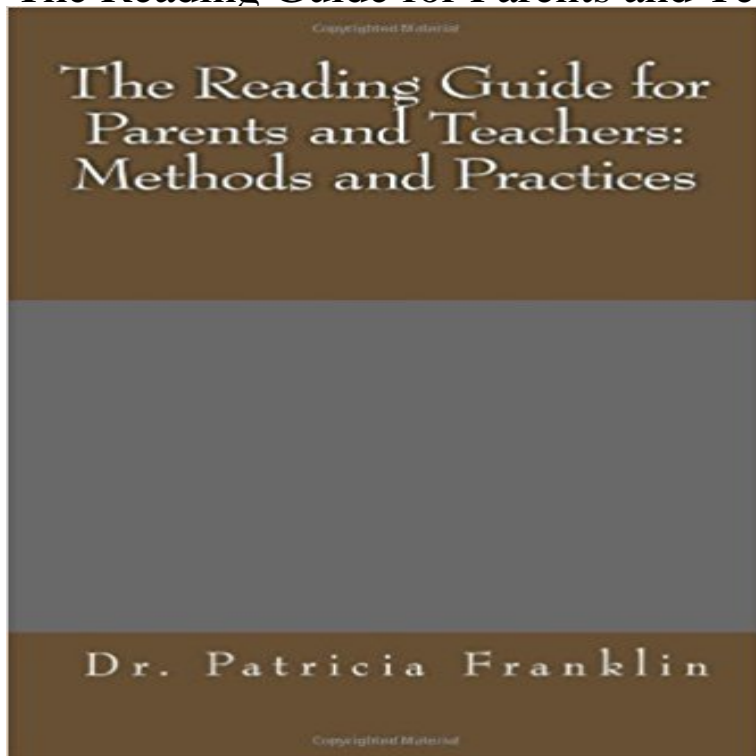


The Reading Guide for Parents and Teachers: Methods and Practices
