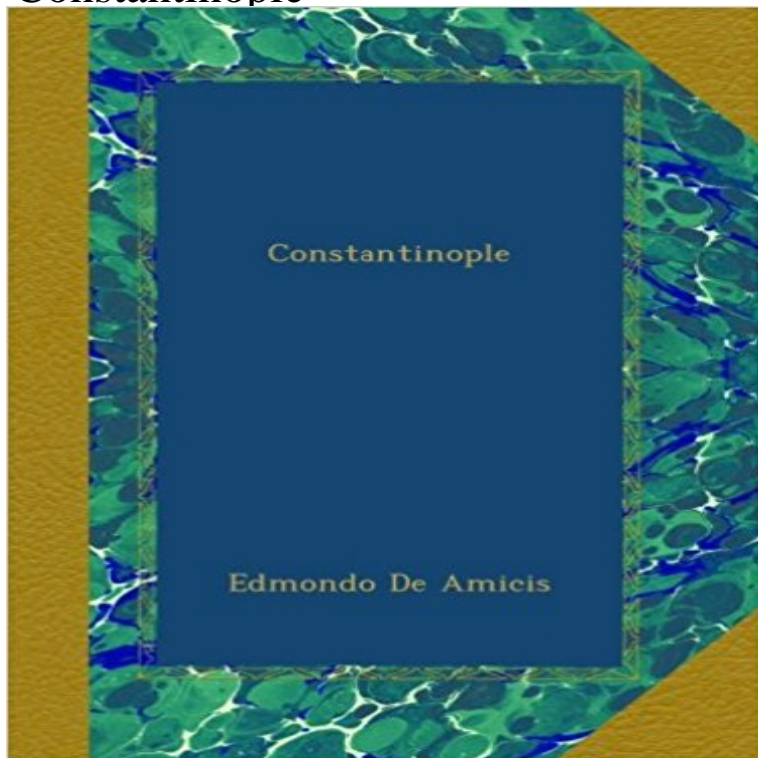


Constantinople
