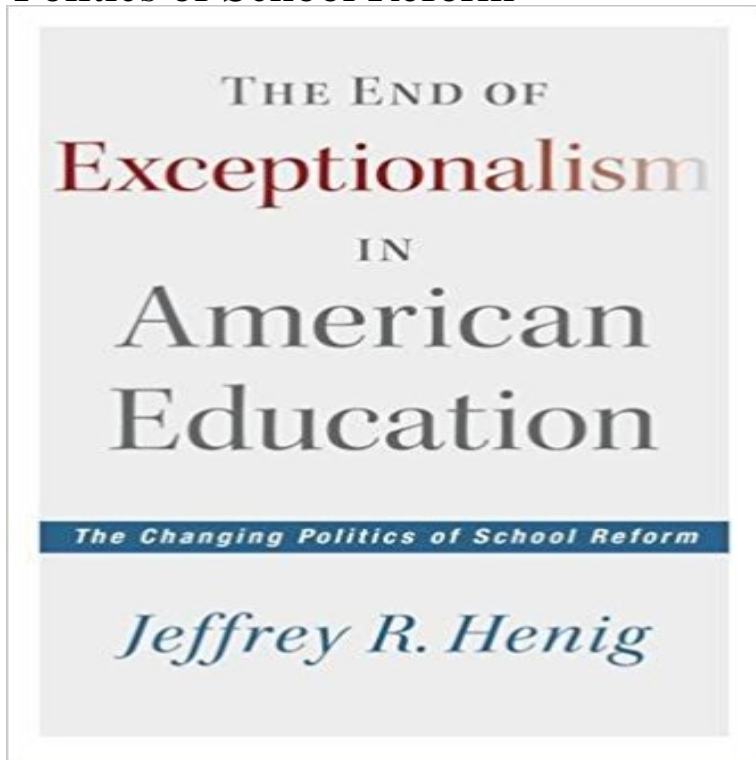


The End of Exceptionalism in American Education: The Changing Politics of School Reform
